- v. Roads & Bridges Lattimer and Commissioner Brown drove around the island to identify paving needs for spring 2019 and to discuss possible ways to reduce/eliminate icy spots. They will talk to the contractor the State selects to pave Main Street in the spring of 2019 about also adding a 5/8-inch top coat to Ferry Landing Beach Road, Dole Road, and a portion of Middle Road near the Jermann's and Burns's residences. Additionally, next spring the Town intends to add a thicker layer of asphalt to the upper portion of Smith Street, the western end of West District Road, Bartlett Harbor Road, and the triangle near Pulpit Harbor, as reported previously.

# 9. Board Member Comments:

- White reiterated his request that the Sheriff's Department install game cameras to determine who is damaging Mullins Head and other properties by doing doughnuts in their vehicles
- White suggested contacting a solar energy company to determine if solar panels might be installed to the Town's benefit at the Water Treatment Plant
- MacDonald noted there should be more streetlights on Iron Point Road. This led to a general discussion about streetlights and whether the Town might obtain lights (perhaps through a grant) that better light the streets but cause less ambient light pollution
