7. Old Business:

- **a.** Ferry Service
 - i. Following the public hearing of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation on 1/28 at which Trevaskis, Emerson and Stone testified, the Board discussed remaining tactics to make sure that the members of the Transportation Committee had all of the necessary arguments and facts before they continued their deliberations at their 'working session' on 2/4. The Board approved an email letter written by Stone on their behalf to be sent to each individual member of the committee and Emerson urged the rest of the Board to consider writing individually as well. The Board is particularly concerned that the Transportation Committee be made to understand that at the 1/28 public hearing the MDOT's Rick Dubois cast a misleading light on the Coast Guard's position on the transportation of diagnostic patient specimens. He continued to refer to them as "hazardous" and overstated the captains' and crew's responsibilities for screening "unattended freight". Emerson asked Stone to ask Sen. Miramant to call Cmdr. Andy Meyers himself so he, as cosponsor of LD1468, would be able to testify to the CG's position that the MSFS has a great deal of commonsense latitude within the scope of their security plan to transport diagnostic specimens if they choose to exercise that latitude.

8. New Business:

- a. Planning Board
 - i. Pat Curtis, Jeff Crawford and Becky Bartovics were present at the Board's request to bring them current on the PB's activities. Curtis reported that the PB had nearly completed the last round of revisions to the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance, incorporating some state-mandated changes. Members of the PB were reluctant to commit to a timeline for completing changes to the Land Use Ordinance, although they have workshops scheduled with Eric Galant of the Midcoast Regional Planning Commission to help them. Among the issues they are coping with is the pre-existing widespread dispersal of commercial enterprises and how and where to allow for economic development. They are also wrestling with some of the inconsistencies between existing development, particularly in the village district as to lot size and setbacks and the requirements in the existing ordinance. The members of the Select Board have been impressed by the amount of work and dedication the PB has brought to their work on revising and updating the ordinances. Curtis noted that future PB members need to understand that documents such as the Land Use should be regularly evolving.
