    - i. Clinic Following up on roof and ceiling work
    - ii. Fire Department/EMS
      - Fire Station Peter Flewelling, representative from Essex Steel, submitted an estimate to construct a 120' x 120' prefabricated steel building that would serve as the fire station, EMS building, and plow truck storage building, as well as containing meeting space and an apartment for the Knox County Deputy Sheriff. The estimate was \$2.8 million, plus additional expenses more than expected.

- EMS EMS Crew Chief Cooper reports that she raised significant money toward a new AED device by offering hands-on CPR training during Community Days. The Board thanks her initiative
- iii. Floats and Docks We received the formal letter from The Island Institute approving a \$10,000 grant for funds to support a working waterfront analysis and additional grant writing.
- iv. Legal George and Martha Neale have offered to donate shore land on Fresh Pond to the Town. Tammy Brown continues to work with the Town's attorney to determine the best way to proceed.
